In October, Cheri will meet with the Boonslick Ministerial Alliance to discuss community needs and to offer guidance on ways they might use their donation to serve the community.






Total Energy Assistance Applications Processed (EA)

October 2023 - Present




Households Receiving Crisis Energy Assistance (ECIP)








Outstanding Housing Vouchers Includes 31 households who are unhoused and 15 who are presently housed

Households Receiving Housing Assistance Payments






Housing Development Updates



Strengthening Communities

Audrain County

The Mexico Sustainability Project is starting Getting Ahead classes in September. CMCA is partnering with them to co-facilitate the classes and provide coaching services for participants.

Community Organizer Mary Rohrbach attended a summit at Mexico Public Schools that focused on school attendance. From this summit, a group was created to make the public and parents aware of the importance of school attendance.



Boone County

CMCA was represented at a dozen back to school events, including at West Middle School, Powerhouse, and Second Baptist Church. We hosted a Resource Fair in Centralia, an event that we hope to reproduce yearly. We have begun planning for two poverty simulations in Boone County, and set forth a timeline for what we hope will be two or three REALL simulations as well. We also spoke at the CATSO Stakeholder Meeting to assist in the planning for future Boone County transportation goals.



Callaway County

The Callaway Senior Expo drew approximately 120 senior citizens to access and connect with resources from about 45 vendors, including employment and volunteer opportunities.

Planning is underway for the Harlem Wizards fundraiser supporting housing development in Callaway County. To date, \$3,500 in sponsorships have been secured for the event.



Strengthening Communities



Cole County

Housing the Community Jefferson City (HCJC) is hosting an Unhoused Summit on November 7th. The summit will include breakout panels on day and overnight shelters, mobile units, affordable housing, and more.

Community Organizer Stephani Thompson was accepted to the Mayor's Housing Taskforce. She is excited to start and see what comes of it.



Cooper & Howard Counties

Community Organizer Cheri Cherry published an oped in the Columbia Missourian about the pause in operations of the New Franklin Cares Food Pantry & Free Store. The column garnered more than 5,600 views on the Cooper-Howard FRC Facebook page. This op-end is the first in an occasional series that Cheri intends to write to bring awareness to topics related to community action and resources that serve our members.



Moniteau & Osage Counties

CMCA participated in Sequential Intercept Model (SIM) Mapping in both Moniteau and Osage Counties. SIM mapping is an approach to identifying community supports and services that can help provide interventions to individuals with mental health or substance use issues who might otherwise flow into the criminal justice system.





Early Childhood Program Updates

We held our annual all-staff pre-service training the first week of August. Staff learned about motivational interviewing, child development topics, and social-emotional supports for children.

The last day of pre-service week was our annual agency picnic, where we held a cake walk, played cornhole, ate snow cones, painted pictures, and just generally had a good time as a CMCA team. 

Note: Some part-year sites are closed for the summer.




Head Start Enrollment & Attendance by Site

August 2024


End of Month Enrollment by Site

August 2024










