Congratulations, Michelle! Thank you for being the incredible leader and team player that you are. Your dedication to our mission shines through in everything you do.





Two schools could not attend due to dangerous weather (Pilot Grove and Fayette), and we had to shelter in place twice that morning because of confirmed tornadoes in the area. 





Audrain County

Community Organizer Mary Rohrbach represented CMCA on planning meetings with CAASTLC, Kids Win Childcare Cohort, the Audrain County Shelter Resource Coalition, and Show Me Strong Communities.



Cole County

CMCA hosted an Energy Clinic at our offices in May. Community Organizer Stefani Thompson also hosted a mini poverty simulation for about 25 people. It was a great discussion!



Boone County

CMCA participated in Hope for Heroes, a Health & Resource Fair, and Family Fun Fest. We shared presentations and resources with residents at True North and families from Central MO Foster Care and Adoption Agency.



Callaway County

The Show Me Strong Communities Early Childhood Coalition hosted an Education Apprenticeship Job Fair to connect high school students interested in careers in education to local early childhood centers. Eight high school students were successfully matched to five apprenticeship sites. Students and worksites were also connected to WIOA services for possible assistance with paid work experience.

Strengthening Communities



Cooper & Howard Counties

CMCA received a \$5,000 grant from Cooper County to assist coaching members with barriers to securing or keeping employment and to continue support of the Employment & Education Expo.

In conjunction with the Cooper County Commissioner's Office, CMCA hosted a Senior Tax Credit Clinic at the Boonslick Senior Center and processed 45 applications. This ordinance for our 62+ homeowners will save approximately \$125/year.

Cooper County Show Me Strong Communities launched their healthy meal kit program in May. Participants received ingredients and recipes to prepare three healthy meals for their families.



Moniteau & Osage Counties

In partnership with MU Extension, we held a kickoff event promoting healthy eating and activity. Participants were able to receive a bag full of vegetables and ingredients to make a meal. The event was part of the Osage Show Me Strong Communities initiative and will repeat in Chamois later this summer.


Head Start Enrollment & Attendance April 2025




Children Affected by Site Closures




Actual Enrollment

Disabilities Enrollment




Head Start Enrollment & Attendance by Site









Head Start Enrollment & Attendance May 2025




Children Affected by Site Closures




Actual Enrollment




Income Eligible Enrollment

Disabilities Enrollment





Head Start Enrollment & Attendance by Site


End of Month Enrollment by Site










Head Start Meals Served


